

Should I go to A&E?

Go to A&E if you are seriously ill, badly injured or have a life threatening condition.

BUT going to A&E in lesser situations means you may have to wait longer to be seen, or other more seriously ill patients cannot be treated while you are being seen. Here's a quick summary of what to do for these common problems and ailments.

They will also say if you need to be seen by a Doctor. For out of hours pharmacies go to 'Useful numbers'.</p>
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Generally unwell • Advice • Hangover • Cough or sore throat • Grazed knee. 	<p>Ring NHS 111 This telephone service is available 24 hours a day, every day - just dial '111' on your phone. They will advise the best course of action and direct you to an appropriate service in your area. For more info go to NHS 111.</p>
