<p>Serious/Life-threatening symptoms:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Heavy bleeding • Difficulty breathing • Burns and scalds • Chest pain • Loss of consciousness • Fits that don't stop • Major trauma or injury 	<p>Go to A&E - the nearest to Wye is William Harvey Hospital in Ashford.</p> <p>If you are not well enough to get there yourself, dial 999 for an ambulance. For more info go to our Out of Hours webpage.</p>
<p>Minor injuries such as:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Sprains and strains • broken bones - arm, foot or ankle • wound infections • minor burns and scalds • minor head injuries • insect and animal bites • minor eye injuries • injuries - back, shoulder, chest 	<p>Come to Wye Surgery's Minor Injuries Clinic during normal surgery hours – please phone first. If we are closed, there are other centres in the area, including:</p> <p>Walk-in Centre, Royal Victoria Hospital, Folkestone Open 8am to 8pm, 7 days a week</p> <p>Minor Injuries Unit, Buckland Hospital, Dover Open 8am to 8pm, 7 days a week</p>
<p>Tummy bugs and upset tummies:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Vomiting • Diarrhoea 	<p>Please avoid coming in to the surgery if you have vomiting and/or diarrhoea as it may be contagious.</p> <p>Instead ask your local pharmacist for advice or phone us on 01233 884 585.</p> <p>Out of hours, call NHS 111 for advice.</p>
<p>Minor health concerns:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Ear pain • Stomach ache • Other aches and pains • Small cuts • Coughs & colds • Headache • Fever • Generally unwell • Need advice • Hungover • Cough or sore throat • Small cuts and grazes 	<p>Ask your local pharmacist for advice and suitable over the counter remedies. They will also advise if you need to see a doctor based on the symptoms and timescales you describe.</p> <p>You can phone us for advice during opening hours on 01233 884 585.</p> <p>Out of hours, call NHS 111 for advice.</p> <p>Or if it is not urgent, you can message our doctors for advice via askmyGP (they aim to respond same day or next working day, depending on your message time).</p>

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
